

An Ordinance Concerning Poll Tax

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of
Providence

Between the ages of Twenty-one and Fifty years: liable to.

Sec. 1. Every male inhabitant in the Town of Providence
between the ages of Twenty-one and Fifty years, who shall have
resided in said Town ten days next preceding demand made
upon him, shall be liable for and required to do one days work
on the Streets, Avenues, Lanes, and alleys of said Town, under
direction and control of the Street Commissioner, or in lieu
of said one days work, shall pay to the Street Commissioner
the sum of two dollars. The year in which said labor or
money in lieu thereof, becomes due, shall commence on
the tenth day of April of each and every year, and end on
the tenth day of April following.

Sec. 2. All persons liable for their labor or commutation
money, as provided in section one of this Ordinance, may pay the
same on the tenth day of April of each year in which the same
becomes due, if paid in money, or as soon thereafter as the Street
Commissioner shall satisfy the person from whom said labor or
commutation is due, as provided for by ordinance reg-
ulating the duties of said Street Commissioner, and if any
person from whom such labor is due shall refuse and
neglect to perform such labor or pay such commutation
money after the time herein before specified, or after due
notice from the Street Commissioner, the person or persons
so neglecting or refusing to perform such labor or pay such
commutation money shall be liable to the Town in the sum
of two dollars and the costs of suit, and upon failure to pay
such judgment when rendered, may be imprisoned until

it shall be paid unless otherwise legally discharged
 Sec. 3. All labor or communication money required by this
 Ordinance shall constitute a special fund to be used in
 cleaning and repairing the streets, alleys and
 the town.

Sec. 4. Clerks and members of the Board of Justice
 during their time of office, and active members of any Fire
 Company of the town, to the number of twenty five for each
 Fire Company and forty for each Hook and Ladder Company
 shall be exempt from paying out any road or street tax
 and shall likewise be exempt from serving on juries in
 town cases.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict
 with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
