

An Ordinance calling a special election to submit to the qualified voters of the Town of Brockton the question whether the Board of Trustees of said Town shall erect water works, and whether the said Board of Trustees shall issue Bonds to defray the expense of erecting said water works.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Brockton:

Section 1. That there be submitted to the vote of the qualified voters of the incorporated Town of Brockton, Massachusetts, who shall have paid the taxes upon property assessed to them in said Town for the last preceding year the question whether the Board of Trustees of said Town of Brockton shall erect or authorize the erecting of water works for said Town of Brockton.

Section 2 That there be submitted to the vote of the qualified electors of the incorporated town of Breckenridge, Colorado, who shall have paid the taxes upon property assessed to them in said incorporated town for the last preceding year, the question whether the bonds of trustees of said town of Breckenridge shall issue bonds of said town of Breckenridge in the sum of twenty five thousand dollars, (\$25,000) or so much thereof as may be necessary, to defray the expenses of erecting said water works. Said bonds to draw interest at not to exceed 6 per cent per annum.

Section 3 That the foregoing propositions set out in sections one and two of this ordinance be submitted at a special election to be held in the said town of Breckenridge, Colorado on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1896 at the places provided by the board of trustees of said town of Breckenridge.

Section 4 That due notice of said special election be given as required by law, and that there be printed on the ballots used at said election, on separate lines the words:

"For the water works"

"Against the water works"

"For the Bonds"

"Against the Bonds"

and those voting at the said special election, who desire to vote for the erection of said water works, shall place in a cross or "X" upon said ballots opposite to or in the margin of the words "For the water works" and those voting at said special election, who desire to vote against the erection of said water works, shall place in ink a cross or "X" upon said ballots opposite to or in the margin of the words: "Against the water works" and those voting at said special election, who desire to vote for the issuance of said Bonds, shall place in ink a cross or "X" upon said ballots opposite to or in the margin of the words "For the Bonds" and those voting at said special election, who desire to vote against the issuance of said Bonds, shall place in ink a cross or "X" upon said ballots opposite to or in the margin of the words "Against the Bonds"

Section 5

That upon the return of the canvass of the vote of said special election according to law if it shall be found that a majority of the voters of said town of Breckenridge who shall have paid taxes on property assessed to them in said town the preceding year, shall have voted in favor of said proposition and the result of said election be so declared there and in that event, the Board of Justice of said town of Breckenridge are hereby authorized and directed to issue said water works and to issue bonds of said town of Breckenridge in the sum of twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000<sup>00</sup>) or so much thereof as may be necessary and to dispose of said bonds at not less than par value and to see the proceeds thereof for the purpose of defraying the expenses of erecting said water works for said town of Breckenridge.

Section 6

The vote cast at said special election shall be canvassed and the result determined as nearly as may be in the manner provided by the laws of the State of Colorado for the canvass of votes for members of the board of Justice for incorporated towns.

Passed by the Board of Justice of the said town of Breckenridge, Colorado, at their regular meeting held June 7<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1878
