

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING TAX LEVY

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Breckenridge.

There shall be levied upon all the taxable property of the town of Breckenridge in the County of Summit and State of Colorado, for the fiscal year ending March 31st 1902 a tax of seven and one half mills on the dollar.

For the maintenance of the water works system for said town, and there shall be levied upon all taxable property in said town of Breckenridge, for the fiscal year ending March 31st. 1902, a tax of seven and one half mills on the dollar, to be placed in the general fund, So that said general fund may equal the annual appropriation and current expenses of said town.

Sec. 2—Such taxes shall be collected as other taxes are collected, and shall be placed in the same proportion as levied to the credit of the water works fund of said town, and to the credit of the general fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of said town.

Sec. 3—Such tax so collected shall be and remain inviolable for maintaining said water works system and said current expenses. Provided, however, that should there be at any time more money in said water works fund than is necessary for said purpose, or should there be more money in said general fund than is necessary to meet the expenses of said town. The surplus in either fund or both funds, may by an order of the Board of Trustees of said town of Breckenridg, "said order to be entered upon the records of their meeting" be placed to the credit of other funds, or it may be diverted to such special purposes as to the Board of Trustees may seem best.

An Ordinance Concerning Tax Levy

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Breckenridge

Section 1. There shall be levied upon all the taxable property of the Town of Breckenridge in the County of Summit and State of Colorado for the fiscal year ending March 31st 1907 a tax of Five out ~~of~~ ^{of} Mills on the dollar for the maintenance of the water

works system for said Town, and there shall be levied upon all taxable property in said Town of Amesbury for the fiscal year ending March 31st 1901 a tax of Five ~~and no part of~~ Mills on the dollar to be placed in the General fund so that said General fund may equal the annual appropriation and current expenses of said Town

Section 2. Such taxes shall be collected as other taxes are collected and shall be placed in the same proportions as levied to the credit of the water works fund of said Town and to the credit of the General fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of said Town

Section 3. Such tax so collected shall to and remain available for maintaining said water works system and said current expenses - Provided however, that should there be at any time more money in said water works fund than is necessary for said purpose, or should there be more money in said General fund than is necessary to meet the expenses of said Town, the surplus in either fund or both funds may, by an order of the Board of Trustees of said Town of Amesbury "said order to be entered upon the records of their meeting" be placed to the credit of other funds or it may be diverted to such special purposes as to the Board of Trustees may seem best
