The ordinance <sup>ordinance</sup> the annual appropriations for the various funds necessary for the yearly expenses of said town was now presented and read, it being in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Specimen: That there be and is hereby appropriated for the purposes of paying the necessary expenses of the town of Specimen, in the County of Summit, and State of Colorado, for and during the fiscal year beginning on the first day of April, 1909, and ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1910, the following amounts, to-wit:

Salary account,	7,000.00
Street Lighting account,	850.00
Fire Department account,	500.00
Water Works account,	500.00
Streets Alleys and Bridges account,	1,000.00
Cemetery Fund account,	500.00
Incidental Expense,	750.00

Section IV. Provided however should there be in any fund more money than is necessary for the purposes of such fund the surplus may by order of the Board of Trustees (such order to be entered upon the records of their meeting) be devoted to such other purpose or purposes as may to said board of Trustees seem best

Section V of the above ordinance was then read, and upon motion of Trustee Foste seconded by Trustee McAdoo the same was adopted by the following vote, Ayes Trustee Guinheimer, Foste, Fry, Rits, McAdoo and Wally, Nays none

Section VI of the above ordinance was then read and upon motion of Trustee Guinheimer, seconded by Trustee Fry the same was adopted by the following vote, Ayes, Trustee Guinheimer, Foste, Fry, Rits, McAdoo and Wally, Nays none

Trustee McAdoo now moved that the ordinance be adopted as a whole, the motion being seconded by Trustee Wally, was carried by the following vote, Ayes, Trustee Guinheimer, Foste, Fry, Rits, McAdoo and Wally, Nays none

Passed and approved this 2nd day of March 1909, at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the said town of Specimen, County of Summit, State of Colorado.
