

An Ordinance creating the Annual Tax Levy for the Fiscal year ending March 31st A.D. 1913, the same being approved by Attorney Whitley was read: It was moved by Trustee Shaw that the Ordinance creating the Annual Tax Levy for the Fiscal year ending March 31st A.D. 1913 as read by the Clerk, be approved and adopted as a whole; seconded by Trustee Shroy; The motion on being put and the roll called resulted in the following vote: Ayes: Traxington, Mays, Shaw, Shroy; Nays: None. So ordered. The following is the Ordinance as passed and approved.

An Ordinance
Creating the Annual Tax Levy
and providing for the Transfer of Funds
for the Fiscal year ending
March 31st A.D. 1913.

Enacted by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Breckenridge in the County of Summit and State of Colorado: That there shall be levied upon all the taxable property of the Town of Breckenridge in the County of Summit and State of Colorado for the Fiscal year ending March 31st A.D. 1913, a tax of two (2) mills on the dollar for the maintenance of the Water Works of said Town; and there shall be levied upon all the taxable property of the Town of Breckenridge for the Fiscal year ending March 31st A.D. 1913, a tax of seven and one-half (7½) mills on the dollar to create

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a Sinking Fund for the redemption of outstanding Water Works Bonds. And there shall be levied upon all the taxable property of the Town of Breeseville, for the fiscal year ending March 31st A.D. 1913, a tax of one-half (1/2) mill on the dollar for the improvement and maintenance of the Cemetery of said Town. And there shall be levied upon all the taxable property of the Town of Breeseville, for the fiscal year ending March 31st A.D. 1913, a tax of five (5) mills on the dollar for the General Fund of said Town, for the redemption of outstanding General Fund warrants.

Section 11. Said taxes shall be collected as other taxes are collected, and shall be placed in the same proportion as levied to the credit of the Water Works Fund of said Town; and to the credit of the Sinking Fund for the redemption of outstanding Water Works Bonds; and to the credit of the Cemetery Fund for the improvement and maintenance of the Cemetery of said Town. And to the credit of the General Fund for the redemption of outstanding General Fund warrants.

Provided however: That should there be at any time, more money in said Water Works Fund than is necessary for said purposes, or should there be at any time, more money in said Cemetery Fund than is necessary for the improvement and maintenance of the Cemetery of said Town, or should there be at any time more money in said General Fund than is necessary for the redemption of outstanding General Fund warrants, the surplus in each fund (or all) may, by order of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Breeseville (the said order to be entered upon the records of their meeting) be placed to the credit of other funds, or it may be devoted to such other special purposes as the Board of Trustees may deem best.
