

ORDINANCE NO. 17

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9-1-21 OF THE BRECKENRIDGE TOWN CODE BY THE ADOPTION OF THE "BRECKENRIDGE TRAILS PLAN" AS A CORRELATIVE DOCUMENT TO THE BRECKENRIDGE DEVELOPMENT CODE; AND AMENDING ABSOLUTE POLICY 17 OF SECTION 9-1-19 OF THE BRECKENRIDGE TOWN CODE CONCERNING PEDESTRIAN CIRCULATION

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF BRECKENRIDGE, COLORADO:

Section 1. Section 9-1-21 of the Breckenridge Town Code, entitled "Correlative Documents", is amended so as to read in its entirety as follows:

Breckenridge Subdivision Ordinance (Chapter 2 of Title 9)

Note: References to Chapters and Titles are to the Breckenridge Town Code

Section 2. Paragraph D of Policy 17 (Absolute) External Circulation, set forth in Section 9-1-19 of the Breckenridge Town Code, is hereby amended so as to read in its entirety as follows:

D. Pedestrian Circulation: Development and installation of pedestrian systems which integrate with existing and future Town pedestrian systems and with the systems of adjacent developments is required. This will include the provision of sidewalks, where required, and the provision of pedestrian walkways pursuant to the Town Trails Plan.

Section 3. Except as specifically amended hereby, the Breckenridge Town Code, and the various secondary codes adopted by reference therein, shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and declares that this Ordinance is necessary and proper to provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity, and improve the order, comfort and convenience of the Town of Breckenridge and the inhabitants thereof.


Section 5. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and declares that it has the power to adopt this Ordinance pursuant to the authority granted to home rule municipalities by Article XX of the Colorado Constitution and the powers contained in the Breckenridge Town Charter.


Section 6. This Ordinance shall be published and become effective as provided by Section 5.9 of the Breckenridge Town Charter.


