AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE <u>UNIFORM PLUMBING CODE</u>, 1997 EDITION, CONCERNING THE REQUIREMENT TO INSTALL A PRESSURE REDUCING VALVE

WHEREAS, the Town of Breckenridge has heretofore adopted the <u>Uniform Plumbing Code</u>, 1997 Edition, and the <u>Uniform Plumbing Code Appendix</u>, Chapters A, B, C and I, published by the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials, 20001 South Walnut Drive, Walnut, California 91789; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Breckenridge finds and determines that the protection of the public health, safety and welfare requires the amendment of that portion of the <u>Uniform Plumbing Code</u>, 1997 Edition, pertaining to the requirement to install a pressure reducing valve.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF BRECKENRIDGE, COLORADO:

<u>Section 1</u>. Section 8-1-6 of the <u>Breckenridge Town Code</u> is hereby amended by the addition of a new Subparagraph (A)(5.5), which shall read in its entirety as follows:

5.5 Chapter 6, subsection 6.082, is hereby amended by the addition of the following new subsection:

608.2 Excessive Water Pressure. Where local static water pressure is in excess of sixty (60) pounds per square inch (552kPa), an approved type pressure regulator preceded by an adequate strainer shall be installed and the static pressure reduced to sixty (60) pounds per square inch (552kPa) or less. For potable water services up to and including one and one-half (1-1/2) inch (38 mm) regulators, provision shall be made to prevent pressure on the building side of the regulator from exceeding main supply pressure. Approved regulators with integral bypasses are acceptable. Each such regulator and strainer shall be accessibly located and shall have the strainer readily accessible for cleaning without removing the regulator or strainer body or disconnecting the supply piping. All pipe size determinations shall be based on eighty (80) percent of the reduced pressure when using Table 6-5.

<u>Section 2</u>. Except as specifically amended hereby, the <u>Breckenridge Town</u> <u>Code</u>, and the various secondary codes adopted by reference therein, shall continue in full force and effect.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and declares that this Ordinance is necessary and proper to provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity, and improve the order, comfort and convenience of the Town of Breckenridge and the inhabitants thereof.

Section 4. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and declares that it has the power to adopt this Ordinance pursuant to the authority granted to home rule municipalities by Article XX of the Colorado Constitution and the powers contained in the <u>Breckenridge Town Charter</u>.

<u>Section 5</u>. This Ordinance shall be published and become effective as provided by Section 5.9 of the <u>Breckenridge Town Charter</u>.

INTRODUCED, READ ON FIRST READING, APPROVED AND ORDERED PUBLISHED IN FULL this 13th day of March, 2001. A Public Hearing shall be held at the regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Breckenridge, Colorado on the 27th day of March, 2001, at 7:30 P.M., or as soon thereafter as possible in the Municipal Building of the Town.
