

ORDINANCE NO. 7

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BRECKENRIDGE TOWN CODE CONCERNING DOGS IN
CARTER PARK

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF BRECKENRIDGE,
COLORADO:

Section 1. Section 6-2B-1 of the Breckenridge Town Code is hereby amended so as to read in its entirety as follows:

6-2B-1: ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE:

- A. Except as provided in this section and in section 11-2-6 of this code, it shall be unlawful for any person to allow an animal to run at large within the Town.
- B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to an ordinary domesticated house cat.
- C. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a trained guide dog assisting a visually impaired person.
- D. The provisions of this section shall not apply to animals that are within the boundaries of a designated dog park.

Section 2. Section 11-2-6 of the Breckenridge Town Code is hereby amended so as to read in its entirety as follows:

11-2-6: ANIMAL RESTRICTIONS WITHIN TOWN PARKS:

- A. Kingdom Park and Riverwalk Center Lawn: Animals are prohibited in those Town parks commonly known as "Kingdom Park" and "the Riverwalk Center Lawn."
- B. Bike Path: Animals are permitted on the paved Town recreational pathway running generally northerly and southerly within the Town and commonly known as the "Bike Path"; provided, however, that while on the Bike Path the animal shall be on a leash not longer than six feet (6') in length and, provided further, that the person in charge of the animal shall not allow the animal to impede or interfere with the movements of any lawful user of the Bike Path. The provisions of Section 6-2C-11 of this Code (Prohibition and Removal of Animal Excrement) shall apply to any person in charge of an animal which is allowed to use the Bike Path.
- C. Cucumber Gulch Preserve Open Space Area: Dogs are prohibited in the Cucumber Gulch Preserve Open Space Area.
- D. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a trained guide dog assisting a visually impaired person.
- E. It shall be unlawful for any person to violate the provisions of this Section.

Section 3. Except as specifically amended hereby, the Breckenridge Town Code, and the various secondary codes adopted by reference therein, shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and declares that this ordinance is necessary and proper to provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity, and improve the order, comfort and convenience of the Town of Breckenridge and the inhabitants thereof.


Section 5. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and declares that it has the power to adopt this ordinance pursuant to the provisions of Section 31-15-401, C.R.S., and the powers possessed by home rule municipalities in Colorado.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be published and become effective as provided by Section 5.9 of the Breckenridge Town Charter.

INTRODUCED, READ ON FIRST READING, APPROVED AND ORDERED PUBLISHED IN FULL this 13th day of February, 2007. A Public Hearing shall be held at the regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Breckenridge, Colorado on the 27th day of February, 2007, at 7:30 P.M., or as soon thereafter as possible in the Municipal Building of the Town.




