

RESOLUTION BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD
OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BRECKENRIDGE, COLORADO

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Breckenridge, Colorado convened at the Town Hall in Breckenridge, Summit County, Colorado, on Tuesday, the 8th day of February, 1966. At said meeting there were present the following: Mayor T. J. Fletcher, and Trustees Joe W. Schneider, Loren R. Emycart, Jack W. Clark, Henry Williams and David Williams.

THEREUPON, the Mayor announced that the Board of County Commissioners of Summit County, acting as a board of Health for said County had determined that the old Kokomo cemetery has been abandoned and has become commons and endangers the health of the people living in the immediate vicinity thereof, and through neglect and non use has been damaged, destroyed, desecrated and partly obliterated, and should therefore be vacated in accordance with the terms and provisions of 1963 Colorado Revised Statutes 66-3-55, 56, 57, 58 and 59 thereof.

THEREUPON, the Mayor stated that the Board of County Commissioners of Summit County were the owners of the north twenty acres of the Masonic Placer which adjoins the present Breckenridge Valley Brook Cemetery along its northern boundary and that the Board of County Commissioners of Summit County have offered to convey the twenty acres of the Masonic Placer to the Town of Breckenridge; to survey and plat the area into cemetery lots, and to fence the area into the present cemetery with fencing like that used on the boundaries of the present cemetery, all at the expense of the County and to receive in exchange, therefor, a plot of land adjacent to the area heretofore acquired for the removal of the graves from the Recen and Robinson Cemeteries. The plot acquired in exchange to be of a size to accommodate about 150 graves in not more than six separate

identifiable plots. Summit County would receive as a further consideration a plot of a size to accommodate ten graves to be used for burial of paupers.

THEREUPON, on motion duly seconded, it was unanimously,

RESOLVED, that the Town of Breckenridge accept the offer of Summit County to convey for cemetery purposes the north twenty acres of the Masonic Placer, and the offer to survey and plat the area for cemetery lots and to fence the area with fencing like that used on the boundaries of the present cemetery, all at no expense to the town, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town of Breckenridge as a consideration for the above and as an exchange will thereupon convey to the County or their designees an area contiguous to that heretofore used for the removal of the graves from the Robinson and Recen cemeteries, and of a size to accommodate about 150 graves in not more than six separate identifiable plots and the town will further provide to the County a plot of a size to accommodate ten graves to be used for the burial of paupers who are a county responsibility, all at no expense to the county.

Unanimously passed, adopted, approved and ordered filed and spread on the minutes.
